The *Parent and Caregiver Tracks* are designed for families of students ages 14 to 21 and include School-to-Work (S2W) information critical for families of students 19 – 21. You are encouraged to attend workshops of interest in any of the tracks!

Plan before you go ~ Suggestions to get the most out of the day

- 1. When you arrive, register and pick up a program. Check on location and time of the workshops you would like to attend. Ask for assistance if you have a question.
- 2. Connect with government agencies in the resource area. The Washington State Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS), Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA), and King County Developmental Disabilities and the School-to-Work (S2W) Program directly fund and/or support transition from school to work and adult employment services. The DSHS/DDA eligibility is necessary for many services in the adult system.
- 3. Meet and interview King County Supported Employment Vendors-highly recommended for students 19 years of age and older.
- 4. Explore other resources and supports such as recreation and leisure, community colleges, housing, and advocacy organizations.
- 5. Use breaks between workshops to talk to the exhibitors or visit with other attendees.
- 6. Food will be available for purchase during the lunch hour at both fair locations and there will also be complimentary refreshments.
